ROSH HASHANAH & YOM KIPPUR SERVICES

SELICHOT

A collection of penitential prayers of forgiveness that we recite to prepare ourselves for the Jewish New Year. This service is specifically tailored to help us direct our hearts and minds toward Teshuvah (repentance).

JUNIOR CONGREGATION

While you are worshipping in the Cohen/Friedkin Sanctuary, our younger congregants are invited to enjoy a High Holy Days experience of their own led by our SLJ (Religious School) team. They will learn about Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur through an engaging prayer experience, creative art project, interesting discussion and connection with friends.

CHILDREN'S SERVICE

Offers families with preschool-aged children a fun, condensed worship experience of stories and prayers to inspire and teach the meaning of the High Holy Days.

FAMILY PRAYER EXPERIENCE

Led by SLJ teens and staff, this alternative worship experience will feature highlights from the traditional Rosh Hashanah service followed by reverse Tashlikh as done through a beach clean.

Reverse Tashlich is an innovative approach to Jewish environmental stewardship. In the ritual of Tashlich on Rosh HaShanah, we go to a body of water and symbolically cast our "sins" into the water to begin the New Year with a clean heart. With Reverse Tashlich, we're turning symbolism into action by removing human "sin" from the water.

Reverse Tashlich provides an opportunity to come together and engage in a hands-on effort to clean up our beaches, rivers, and shorelines, removing the plastic, trash, and other debris that threaten marine ecosystems and our planet's health.

TASHLICH

Tashlich originated during the Middle Ages as a custom of going to a body of water and symbolically casting our sins (by tossing pieces of bread) into the water.

SHABBAT SHUVAH

This is the Shabbat between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur that is referred to as "The Sabbath of Return."

TIME FOR MEMORIAL

Distance does not allow many of us to perform the mitzvah of visiting the burial places of our beloved relatives and friends. Time for Memorial is an opportunity for you and your family to light candles, offer prayers, and remember your loved ones that have passed on.

KOL NIDRE

The Erev Yom Kippur service begins with the Kol Nidre prayer, a powerful declaration that awakens our souls as we prepare for the most solemn day of the Jewish year.

FAST TALK

We are taught to treat the entire day of Yom Kippur as one long day of study and prayer. This hour-long afternoon study session is a learning opportunity for us to continue reflecting on the meaning of Yom Kippur and repentance.

YIZKOR

We join as a community to support one another in honoring the memories of our loved ones. Yizkor is a memorial prayer service that takes place on Yom Kippur. The service includes prayers for the deceased and is a time for the community to remember those who have passed away through prayer, silence, and the recitation of names.

NEILAH

Neilah literally means "closing" and refers to the symbolic closing of the gates of heaven and, hence, God's willingness to hear the prayers of the Jewish people. As the sun sets, we invite you to conclude the Day of Atonement with the final sounding of the shofar.

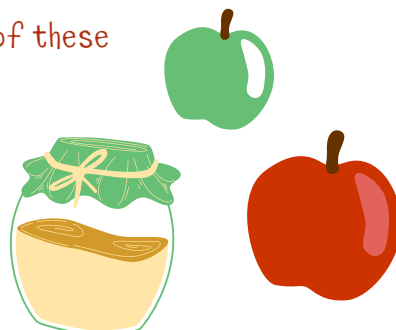
ROSH HASHANAH

GUIDE TO THE HIGH HOLY DAYS

MEMBER TICKETS

Tickets for High Holy Day services are complimentary with Congregation B'nai Israel membership for all members listed on your account.

To request tickets, **members must log in to their ShulCloud account and complete the online registration.** You must be current on your congregational commitment by Erev Rosh Hashanah to receive and use your tickets.

MEMBER TICKETS

New this year, Members must purchase tickets and register their guest **directly through the member ticket registration form in their ShulCloud account.** Guest tickets are \$180 and include both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services.

Tickets for the Rosh Hashanah Family Prayer Experience and NCECE Children's Services on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur may be purchased individually.

COMMUNITY GUEST TICKETS

We welcome community guests to join us for the High Holy Days. Tickets for High Holy Day services are \$225 and include both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. *There is not an option to purchase tickets for individual holidays or services.*

RECIPROCITY

Reciprocity is available for Congregation B'nai Israel members in good standing who will be out of town during the High Holy Days and wish to attend services at another Union for Reform Judaism congregation.

Similarly, Congregation B'nai Israel will provide complimentary tickets for out-of-town visitors who arrange for courtesy admission through their home congregation. Please contact the Clergy Office for more information.

SPECIAL ADMISSION

Active-duty service members and college students will be admitted without tickets by showing a valid identification at check in.

SEATING ACCOMMODATIONS

Special seating is available to our members with special needs that would otherwise prevent them from attending High Holy Day Services. Contact Minda Shaiman at minda@cbiboca.org for more information.

Preparations are necessary to provide special seating accommodations. Please be so kind to request special needs accessible seating **no later than the week before services you will be attending.** We may not be able to honor late requests.

All approved accommodations will be held until 15 minutes after the beginning of each worship service. At that time, all unoccupied seats will be released for general congregational worship. Large-print books will be available.

SECURITY

Our security team has developed procedures to enhance safety, ensuring that all attendees are verified and preventing potential threats from entering the premises.

All visitors must present identification and pass through metal detectors. In order to facilitate a smooth admittance process, please do not bring backpacks or large bags to services, as all of these items will be subject to a security search.

If you decide to use a ride sharing service such as UBER or LYFT please note you will be required to show your registration for the vehicle to enter and drop you off inside the campus.

PARKING

Members and their registered guests will receive a parking pass for High Holy Days services, which must be displayed on the dashboard for entry onto the campus. Please ensure the pass is clearly visible to assist with a smooth and secure entry process.

There are a limited number of handicap accessible spots available on a first come, first serve basis.

Join us for a meaningful Sukkot Festival Service that includes the Yizkor memorial prayers—a sacred time to remember and honor our loved ones.

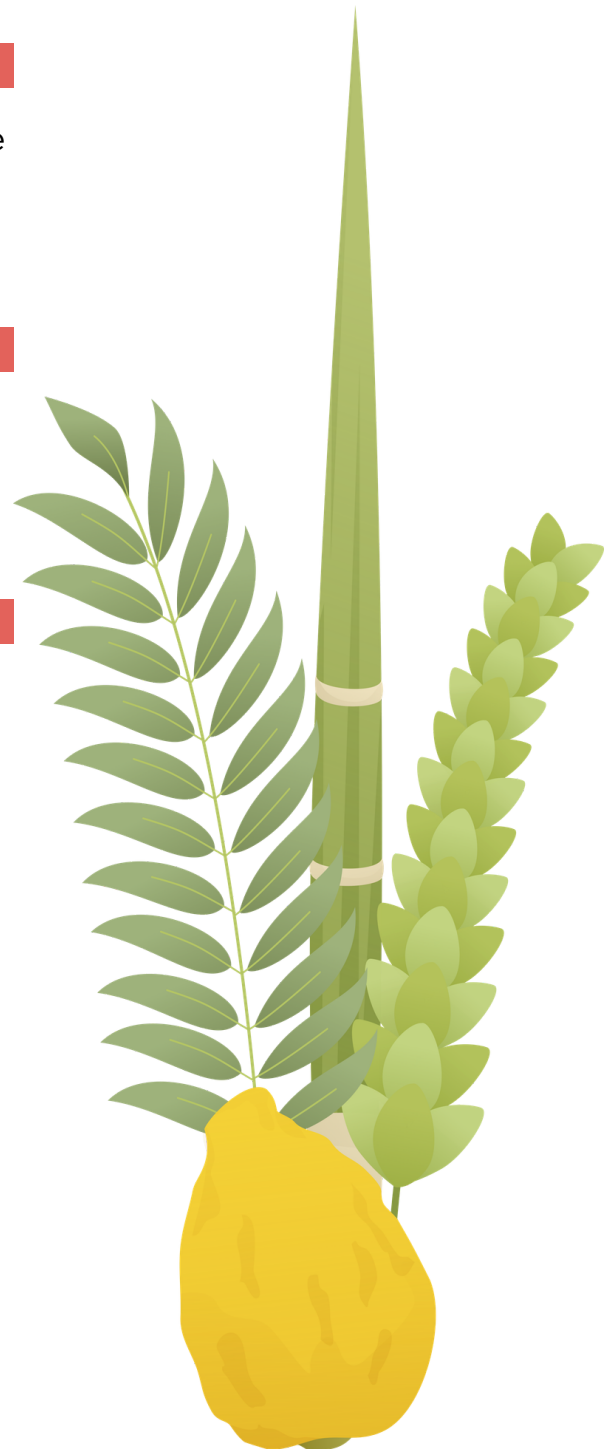
